We will be immersed in the natural beauty of Nepal as well as meeting and interacting with the peoples who have made this place their home for thousands of years.

You will explore some ancient and magnificent UNESCO World Heritage sites in the Kathmandu Valley before heading off to the remote Solukhumbu region where we will adventure through rhododendron, oak, and bamboo forests. We will journey through local farm areas at varying altitudes, along enchanting rivers, and see stunning views of the famous Mt. Everest.

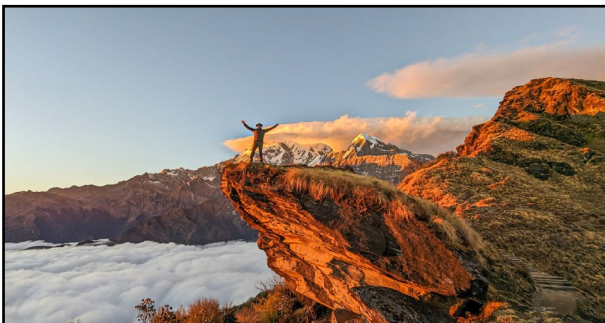

She has presented about Himalayan and Appalachian musics and culture in Nepal and the US at places like The Smithsonian Folklife Festival, National Geographic, The Rubin Museum, and many festivals, universities, and arts organisations. With her fun loving nature, expertise and networks of friends and colleagues throughout Nepal, she can provide a really fun and unique trip.
